# **NEWSLETTER SYSTEM CHANGE**

We have been using a service called <u>MailerLite</u> to send newsletters to subscribing classmates. However, MailerLite has become extremely difficult to use, so much so that we have chosen to change to a different newsletter platform.

This September 2024 issue is a test of the Beehiiv system.

#### **Subscribers**

We have copied the subscriber list from MailerLite to Beehiiv. This means your email client may not recognize the new platform as safe and friendly. You may need to look in your spam or junk folder and if you find the newsletter there, mark it as not spam or not junk.

### Formatting

The Beehiiv editor produces clean, readable content. Formatting is not as fancy as in MailerLite but that is probably an advantage, considering that many of us appreciate text that is easily readable.

# **CORPORATION, COUNCIL, COMMITTEE**

It must be confusing to hear these different terms: the corporation, the council, and the reunion committee. Here is what those terms mean.

## The Corporation

In 2024, <u>the Reunion Committee formed a nonprofit corporation</u> to help protect individuals and to assure continuity of reunion planning expertise. The official name of the corporation is MOUNT RAINIER 1974. When we use it this way (all in capital letters) it stands for the official name of the corporation. The nonprofit is a 501(c)(7) "social club" and unlike a 501(c)(3) organization, MOUNT RAINIER 1974 is not a charitable nonprofit. This means donations to the corporation are not tax deductible.

## The Council

The corporation has a board of directors described in the <u>articles and bylaws</u> as the council of directors. Six classmates were elected as council directors and those directors elected a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer from the six directors. The council manages the business affairs of the corporation.

## The Committee

The Reunion Committee (also called the committee) is a group of people who volunteer their time and talent to help plan class events. This group generally includes the council and several other individuals who are able to help. Volunteers are always welcome!

# **NEW COUNCIL and OFFICERS**

Before and during the 50th Reunion, the <u>Class of 1974 elected a new six-person Council</u>. On August 20, 2024, the Council elected officers and set the initial terms, per the Corporation's bylaws:

- President: Kerry Brown (term ending August 2026)
- Vice President: Paula Rudberg Lowe (term ending August 2025)
- Secretary: Suzy Van Hout Lindeke (term ending August 2026)
- Treasurer: La Hean (Heim) Rohland (term ending August 2025)
- Director: Steve Carlson (term ending August 2026)
- Director: Tom Salzer (term ending August 2025)

The term of office for three of the six Council positions will expire in August 2025 so an election for those three spots will be held then. This complies with the <u>Bylaws of the</u> <u>Corporation</u>. Setting terms was also necessary because this was the first election of officers and the council needs to assure that future elections are staggered. Staggered terms help assure continuity.

# WHEN is the NEXT EVENT?

Since the 50th Reunion, several side conversations have happened around some kind of next event. Ideas have ranged from having a picnic at a park to a more structured kind of thing.

While many people seem to want to get together next year, one idea has taken hold with a number of people: get together in two years. Many classmates will turn 70 years old in 2026 so this could turn into a 70th birthday celebration for the Class of 1974.

No firm plans have been made and that means there is still plenty of time to share your ideas. Two good places to share thoughts and discuss ideas are the class Facebook group and the new group email system (see the next item for more about this):

# NEW GROUP EMAIL SYSTEM

A new email group for the Class of 1974 launched near the end of August. Join 41 classmates (as of yesterday) in the group at this link: <u>https://gaggle.email/join/mrhs1974@gaggle.email</u>

As requested by several classmates, this service is configured to hide email addresses. Each message has an option to reply only to the sender or you can reply to the entire group. You can use the "reply only to sender" as a way to share your email address with specific people and to ask for their contact information.

The group is not moderated but we expect classmates will be respectful. We suggest avoiding the topics of politics, sex, and religion as those can often become divisive.
